Speakers' Profiles

Jeremy Harmer

Jeremy has an international reputation as an author, teacher trainer and expert in ELT methodology. He has trained teachers and offered seminars all over the world. He is the author of methodology titles including *How to teach Writing*, *How to Teach English*, *The Practice of English Language Teaching* and *Essential Teacher Knowledge* all published by Pearson ELT. He is the General Editor of the Longman methodology list. His teaching days were spent in Mexico and the UK and since 1983 he has been a full-time writer and freelance trainer. His course materials and teachers' guides are used all over the world.

Ben Goldstein

Ben is a teacher, teacher trainer and materials writer. He works at the Universitat Oberta de Catalunya in Barcelona and on the MA TESOL Program of the New School, New York. He is the author of the adult course book *English Unlimited Advanced* and the methodological handbook *Working with Images* (both Cambridge) and course books *New Framework* and *The*

Big Picture (Richmond). His interests in ELT include intercultural awareness and visual literacy.

John Hughes

John is a teacher, teacher trainer and course book author. He has taught in Austria, Poland, Italy, Malta, and the UK and has published a number of course books and resources materials. His books include *Spotlight on FCE* (2007) and *Practical Grammar* both published by Heinle. He is also involved in online teacher training courses.

Ken Wilson


Ken is a teacher trainer and author of ELT. He trained to be an English teacher with International House London and taught English in Seville before moving back to IH London, where he worked as a teacher and teacher trainer before going freelance. In the seventies, he wrote and recorded *Mister Monday*, the first-ever collection of ELT songs. Since then he has written and recorded about 150 language teaching songs. Until 2002, he was artistic director of the English Teaching Theatre, a theatre company which used to tour the world performing stage-shows for learners of English. Ken attends a lot of ELT conferences and usually gives workshops on using music and drama.

Nicholas Peachey

Nicholas has worked as an ELT Teacher, Teacher Trainer and ICT trainer for both British Council and International House in schools around the world. He is also a materials writer and has worked on a number of CD-ROM projects for British Council and Longman ELT and contributed both teaching and training materials to a number of websites. In May 2012 he won a British Council Elton for Excellence in Course Innovation for the Blended Learning in ELT course. He is an experienced virtual and physical conference presenter and has delivered educational technology related talks and workshops at major conferences all over the world.

Evan Frendo

Evan is a freelance business English trainer, teacher trainer and author specializing in Business English and English for Specific Purposes. He has wide experience of the Business English industry, having worked in companies both large and small in various parts of the
